

Release: Final document of the 6th International Longevity Forum

Rio de Janeiro – "It is quite simple. The future of ageing will be defined by the levels of fairness throughout the life course. The future of our ageing depends on the future ageing of others", says Alexandre Kalache, President of ILC-BR (International Longevity Centre Brazil) in the context of the discussions of the 6th International Longevity Forum that took place on 22nd and 23rd of November 2018, at the headquarters of Bradesco Seguros in Rio de Janeiro.

The Forum, which had as its theme the "Future of Ageing", resulted in a document entitled "Designing the Future of Ageing". This document presents the central ideas of the discussions that addressed issues such as technology and innovation, long-term and primary care, and cross-cutting issues, such as inequality, gender and race. The report highlights that gender, race/skin color, educational level and social conditions are essential determinants in the construction of longevity - both at an individual and at societal level. Ageing is a dynamic relational process. A life course marked by unmet needs, limited access or outright exclusion, accumulates disadvantages and becomes amplified in older age.
